2.2 Grounds and Facilities

A detail report of the facilities including space for 140 head of cattle, sleeping quarters large enough to hold 150 people, ideally in four different dorms, two minimum, and anything else relevant to showing cattle, unloading facilities, wash bay, MAP segregation ease.
