GENERAL INFORMATION

Angus Youth invites all young beef enthusiasts to participate in the 2010 Landfall Angus Youth National Roundup. The committee is working hard to ensure that you'll enjoy the event, make new friends, and learn a heap about the Australian beef industry!

You don't have to have your own Angus cattle to participate in the Roundup. Provided you send your entry form in on time, the committee hopes to arrange an animal for you to borrow for the duration of the Roundup. If not enough ballot cattle can be found, it may be necessary for some participants to share a heifer.

Competitors will be split into AGE based groups - JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE and SENIOR - for the duration of the Roundup. This includes the industry day sessions, paraders and junior judging competitions.

Designated sleeping areas, with adult supervision, will be provided for participants staying on the showgrounds. In addition, a security guard will be hired for the Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. However, participants may choose to stay off grounds but no responsibility will be accepted while participants are off the grounds.

Entry Fee includes the full Roundup educational and fun program and participant's meals from dinner Thursday 14th to lunch Sunday 17th, including our 3 course Special Dinner and Dance featuring Certified Australian Angus Beef.

Parents and guests who mention the Roundup to the Comfort Inn Blazing Stump (02 6056 3433) will receive a discount for their stay during the Roundup.

Help and participation from parents would be greatly appreciated. Please complete Volunteers section (page 9) if you are able to assist. The Roundup committee encourages parents, particularly of younger children who will be sleeping on the grounds, to sleep with your children. Children 10 and under will need to have a parent stay with them if staying on the grounds. In addition, we invite parents and friends to attend the Special Dinner and Dance on the Saturday night.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Participants are to be between eight (8) & twenty-five (25) years of age inclusive at 1st January 2010. If a participant is under 18, a parent/guardian must sign the entry form
2. Angus Australia membership is not required to attend the 2010 Landfall Angus Youth National Roundup. A membership application is attached and fees are set to encourage membership. Non members pay a higher entry fee.
3. Cattle classes:
 - Age of cattle will be taken from the 1st January 2010.
 - Cattle (except steers) must be registered Black or Red Angus with relevant breed societies to be eligible for competition. All cattle must comply with society rules and regulations. All cattle will be inspected for tattoos/NLIS tags, teeth, white skin, etc. If incorrect, absent, or illegible the animal will be disqualified from the animal judging.
 - All cattle entered will be divided into classes according to age and the number of entries after the entry closing date has passed.
 - There will be classes for steers, bulls, heifers, and cows.
 - A heifer must be under twenty-four (24) months. Animals with calves at foot are eligible for heifer or cow classes.
 - The maximum age for the calf at foot is nine (9) months.
 - Steers must be at least 50% Angus and have no more than two permanent teeth.
 - Bulls must be under seventeen (17) months of age (Born on or after the 1st August). *Please Note: Handlers of Bulls over 12 months must be 16 years or older.*
 - Any animal that is infected with ringworm must have a vet certificate stating that the animal has been treated or washed in the previous four (4) days with appropriate fungicide. Further washings are to be carried out on the showground under supervision of a committee member.
 - To be eligible for the owned and bred class the animal must be registered in the exhibitor's name and the exhibitor must have bred the animal himself or herself. The animal will still be eligible for competition in the general cattle classes. You must state on your entry form which animal you wish to enter in this class.
 - Sawdust bedding will be supplied
4. There will be no subsidising of transport by Angus Youth. However if you need help to find transport we may be able to organise lifts for people and cattle from common areas. Contact: Carol Grylls 03 5997 7169.
5. Nose clips or rings and neck straps are compulsory! All cattle must be led with a nose ring or nose grip and must be tied with a neck strap and a secure halter in the stalls at all times.
6. Insurance: Liability in relation to any cattle remains with the owner. It is strongly recommended that livestock owners are covered by a current liability policy that extends to shows. Liability in relation to participants and spectators at the Landfall Angus Youth National Roundup is covered by a Roundup insurance policy.
7. Participants between the ages of 8 and 15 may only enter one animal each. Participants 16 years and over may enter up to three animals. There will be a charge of \$30 for each additional animal, and should there be a shortage of animals the exhibitor is encouraged to let a participant without their own animal borrow the extra animals. If animals are borrowed the \$30 fee will be refunded.
8. All animals require a herd health form. Please advise the Johnes status of your animals. Cattle will be stalled according to their Johnes status, to comply with JD MAP Regulations.

Cattle from Controlled, Protected, Check Tested, Beef Only, Unassessed or Johnes Tested Herds are eligible for competition.
9. No requirements for Pestivirus are set for the Roundup. Breeders are advised to protect their own stock to ensure that no animal is infected should a Pestivirus infected animal be present. Consult your veterinarian if necessary.
10. NLIS tags are compulsory under national legislation for all cattle before they leave their property. If you are bringing animals please supply your Property Identification Code (PIC) on the entry form and the number of animals that will be using the PIC. Animals will be recorded on the NLIS database as 'sighted' at the Wodonga Exhibition Centre during the 2010 Roundup. After the Roundup, cattle will remain registered on the NLIS database as located on their pre-Roundup PIC. For any cattle that are returning to a different property after the Roundup, the receiving producer must make the normal PIC to PIC transfer from the first property to the second property on the NLIS database.
11. Management and control of the Roundup will be in the hands of the Roundup Committee and their decision shall be final.
12. Disruptive and unacceptable behaviour from exhibitors will not be tolerated. Unacceptable behaviour may lead to disqualification from competition.
13. There will be no smoking in the cattle sheds, toilets, eating area or sleeping area.
14. Adequate footwear must be worn at all times. Thongs and sneakers etc are not acceptable in cattle areas.
15. **No alcohol** will be permitted on the grounds. Competitors not abiding to this rule will face immediate disqualification and removal from the grounds. This condition of entry will be policed. Participants are encouraged to remain on the grounds for the duration of the Roundup. If you leave the grounds you do so on your own responsibility.
16. AY curtains will be hung above the cattle during the Roundup.
17. Any form of advertisement is not permitted to be shown during the Roundup unless the stud is an official sponsor of the 2010 Landfall Angus Youth National Roundup. Advertising signs from sponsors will be displayed on the Roundup Sponsorship Wall of Fame.
18. Competitors may stay off the show grounds. On Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights a security guard will be hired and adult supervision of the designated sleeping area will be provided. However, the Committee will not take responsibility for the competitors after programmed activities have finished.
19. All electrical equipment must have an in-line circuit breaker and all power leads must have a current certificate from a registered electrician as required by law.
20. T-shirts will be supplied to all competitors whose entries are received by the 4th December 2009, and are to be worn during the animal judging competition.
21. The herdsman competition is judged over the three days. Aspects taken into account by roaming judges will include participation, teamwork, citizenship, presentation, and animal care. To score well in this competition older/more experienced participants will need to help their buddy. Participants whose parents/non-participant friends prepare their animal for them will not score well.
22. While everything is done to ensure the safety of participants and their animals and every care will be taken by those in charge of the Roundup, the committee is not responsible for any accident or sickness that may occur through any source whatsoever. It must be clearly understood that each participant will only be permitted to attend the Roundup on the understanding that the participant or parent/guardian signing this form agrees to indemnify the committee against any claim.
23. Roundup entry fees are refundable prior to the 1st January 2010 with T-shirt cost deducted. **No refunds will be made after the 1st January 2010.**

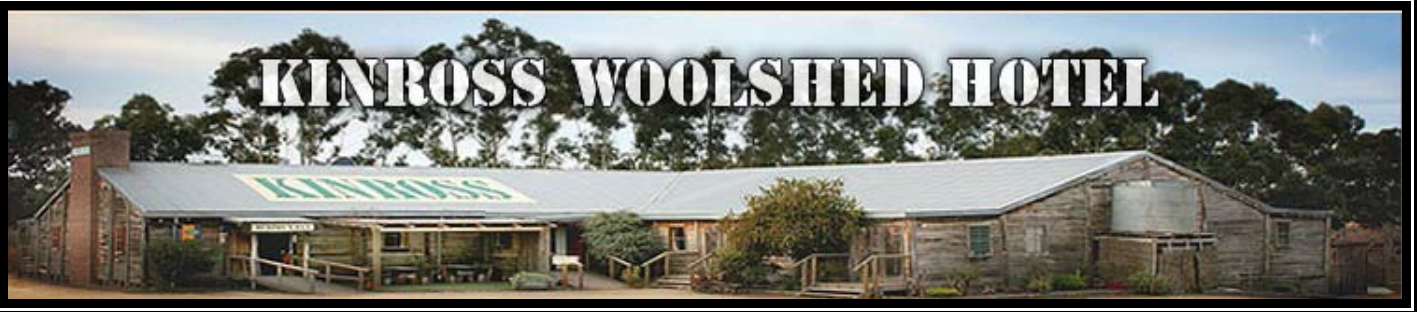
